Suit for declaration to the effect that Shri Kaushal Kumar son of Shri Pirthi Singh who was posted as PTI at Government Senior Secondary School Choutala, District Sirsa, who left his school on 31.05.2010 on account of summer vacations in the afternoon but thereafter did not resume his duties after the summer vacation on 01.07.2010 and did not reach his house at Choutala and Kalanwali after 31.05.2010 and whose whereabouts are not known to the plaintiffs, other relatives, colleagues, friends and all other persons who could have naturally known about his whereabouts for a period of seven years starting from 31.05.2010, and thus he is legally presumed to be dead because he could not be traced despite best efforts made by the plaintiffs, relatives friends and colleagues etc. at all places where he could have been found, consequently as a result of death of Shri Kaushal Kumar the plaintiffs are entitled to get all the monetary benefits arising from his death like provident fund, gratuity, leave encashment etc., alongwith interest at the rate of 18percent per annum from due date till payment, further they are also entitled to get last drawn salary by Shri Kaushal Kumar under the provisions of Haryana (Compassionate Assistance to the dependants of deceased Government Employees) Rules 2006, since after 31.05.2010 and they are also entitled to the arrears etc. alongwith interest at the rate of 18percent per annum from due date till payment and the action of the defendants in not releasing these benefits to the plaintiffs is illegal, null and void, against the Statutory Rules and principles of natural justice, as a consequential relief the defendants be directed by way of mandatory injunction to release all the benefits referred to above to the plaintiffs arising from the grant of declaration claimed above alongwith interest at the rate of 18percent per annum from due date till payment, on the basis of evidence of every description oral as well as documentary.
